BEi participated in the Business to Business Food Challenge again this year. Three individuals from BEi traveled to Allegheny Valley Elementary School to assist volunteers from the Rouse in gathering and weighing food items that were dropped off. Last year, BEi donated 105 lbs. of food and \$209 to the challenge. Our goal this year was to beat last year's amount collected by 10% (115.5 lbs. of food and \$230).
